## Title of Bill: Prevention of Cigarette Litter 1 Be It Enacted By The American Legion Auxiliary New Mexico Girls State 2016 2 Section I. Body: Cigarettes can and have been known to cause air pollution\* 3 along with harm to the smoker and surrounding persons. As Nation, we enacted certain regulations to minimize harm to bystanders, in New Mexico, the bill 4 was the Dee Johnson Clean Indoor Air Act. I believe we must further extend 5 regulation, the focus must be the litter. Cigarette butts are one of the most common roadway litter items across the Nation. It must be enforced that the cigarette butts are disposed of properly. With this bill, we can further contribute to the prevention of littering. 6 7 Section II. Definitions: \*The air pollution emitted by cigarettes is 10 times greater than diesel car 8 exhaust, suggests a controlled experiment, reported in Tobacco Control. 9 Environmental tobacco smoke produces fine particulate matter, which is the most dangerous element of air pollution for health. 10 The Dee Johnson Clean Indoor Air Act eliminates smoking in enclosed indoor 11 workspaces including restaurants, bars, and other workplaces. 12 Section III. Penalty: I want cigarette butts to be disposed of properly, in 13 hope, we can eliminate cigarette litter. I want this bill to further extend cigarette regulation, also enforce penalties if in violation of the possible 14 law. The smoker must dispose of the cigarette butt in the designated 15 container. 16 Section IV. Repeal: All laws, acts, provisions, or parts of laws contained in 17 the Constitution of the State of New Mexico in conflict with any provision of this act are herby repealed. 18 19 Section V. Effective Date: This act shall become effective immediately upon It's passage and approval by the American Legion Auxiliary New Mexico Girls 20 State Governor or its otherwise becoming a law. 21
