Title: The Reform of New Mexico's Education Act

Section I. Body: Students should go through standardized education until they

reach the end of their eighth grade year. At this time, students who meet a

certain standard should be allowed to choose whether to go on a college bound

path or a vocational path. This would allow schools to teach students what

they really need to know early on, along with separating students based on

scholastic ability. This would also allow teachers more one on one time because of the fewer number of students that would be in their class.

Section II. Definitions: A. "vocational" being special skills, training, etc., that you need for a particular job or occupation

Section III. Penalty: Existing high schools would be converted into either a

college bound high school or a vocational training school. Students meeting

certain criteria would then be able to choose which they wished to attend

after going through standardized schooling until eighth grade.

Section IV. Repeal: All laws, acts, provisions, or parts of laws contained in

the Constitution of the State of New Mexico in conflict with any provision of

this act are herby repealed.

Section V. Effective Date: The provisions of this act shall be effective on

and after the 2017-2018 school year starting with kindergartner class of 2017.
